## About Women's Council.

Liberal Women's Council is an official organisation of the Liberal Party that seeks to engage, promote and foster the professional and personal ambitions of female members and develop policy on issues that affect women.

The Council holds regular meetings and social events as well as offering assistance and support to female candidates contesting elections.

The President of the Council is a member of the Liberal Party's State Executive and a delegate for the Federal Council and Federal Women's Committee of the Party.

Council also elects 12 delegates to State Council, the governing body of the South Australian Liberal Party.

## Our history.

South Australian Liberal women have achieved many political firsts.

From the first female political candidate (1924), the first female elected to our Federal (1955) and State (1959) Parliaments, the first female leader of a major South Australian Party (2009) and the first female Deputy Premier and Attorney General (2018), Liberal Women's Council has been witness to each occasion.

With a history as far back as 1910, the Liberal Women's Council continues to ensure female representation at the highest levels of the Liberal Party.



## Getting involved.

Liberal Women's Council seeks to bring together all female members of the South Australian Liberal Party.

Membership of the Council provides an opportunity to build relationships with Liberal Members of Parliament and other like minded individuals in a casual atmosphere.

Policy forums and debates are held during the year for those who are interested and pre-eminent South Australians are often invited to speak at Council Meetings and social events.

Registration is at no cost and is open to all female members of the Liberal Party.
